Dear friends of St. John the Evangelist,

As we've shared in previous bulletins, this month of November has been exciting and full of firsts. The opening of our Pre-School ministry is certainly a great joy and worthy of celebration. Structural work has begun on the classrooms including new fire doors, reinforced wall, and ceiling modifications. Fortunately, the rooms also already have upgraded heating and cooling controls thanks to our yearlong Pastoral Center temperature work project. Cold November days have proven the updated system most valuable and necessary!

A "normal" November would find us together for our annual parish Christmas Bazaar during these very days. I think of the knitting club, the St. John's Guild, the Over 60 Club, the Knights of Columbus, and always the steadfast leadership and efforts of the Catholic Women's Club. Holy Mass and the Sacrament of Confession are celebrated frequently and regularly so that we may be nourished at the life-giving streams of God's abundant grace. Yes, grace abounds!
