The hospital bed was close enough from her "ironing room" to hear us call to her in mom's final moments, where she could be present.

Whereupon Ozzie said, "You were a treasure."

Jesus, in prayer, is asking for that kind of dedication from the people in that time, to today in the new millennium. May we all have the courage to deliver.

Ozzie's love and compassion was day to day, week by week, for more than 40 years. Our commitment is similar...day by day. We pray today that our loving efforts will be fruitful and stand the test of time.....together forever under God!

Here is a home recipe (originating from the 1950s) shared by one of our faithful that we offer for mothers. NOTE: Be sure to consult with your child's physician before using this formula!

BABY FORMULA INGREDIENTS
CARNATION UNSWEETENED EVAPORATED MILK (use specifically for this formula)

1 can 13oz. (354) Full fat Carnation Evaporated milk;
2 1/3 Cups (19 fluid ounces/562ml) of Clean water preferably slightly warm;

2 Tablespoons of BlackStrap Molasses (best) Or Granulated white Sugar;

Use bottles of choice, boil, cool,...6 bottles recipe.

One (1) day use only!

*Give separately as a nutritional Supplement;

1 dose multi vitamin for infants daily/ Check with your Pediatric Physician.

Mixing Instructions: Mix above ingredients in well cleaned bowl or pan, or shaker, or blend until smooth. (IF using granulated white Sugar, be sure to mix until it has been dissolved completely).

1 (ONE) Batch Formula will last 1 (One) Day

Remember to make a new Batch each day. Throw out remainder from day before even if not used.

MAKE NEW BATCH EVERY DAY; It is a work of LOVE for your precious BABY.



Proportion according to age of Baby

0 – 2 Months = 2-3 ounces every 2 – 3 hrs (approx. 24 oz. per day)

2 – 3 Months = 4-5 ounces every 3 – 4 hrs (approx. 32 oz. per day)

4 – 5 Months = 4-6 ounces every 3 – 4 hrs (approx. 32 – 36 oz per day)

6+ Months = 6 – 8 ounces every 4 – 5 Times a Day (approx. 32 – 40 oz per day)

Remember to give multi vitamin per Pediatric instructions separately, never add to formula.

FOLLOW UP VISITS: Upon request by contacting the pastoral minister, a follow-up visit will be made to the home post-surgery and/or illness during the recuperation period.

HOLY COMMUNION FOR THE SICK AND HOMEBOUND: One on One home care visits to the Sick and Homebound residents. Please call if you or someone you know would like to receive.

HELP NEEDED: In this Spiritually Filled Vocation, help is needed to bring Holy Communion to confined Catholic residents, Home visits or Nursing home visits. Contact Francesca if you are interested in this Highly Spiritual Vocation, a given from your heart of Spiritual Love, bringing Jesus, the Holy Eucharist, to those who cannot receive HIM without help from you. Francesca will assist you and train you personally. ALL CALLS ARE CONFIDENTIAL.

BEREAVEMENT: A bereavement counseling visit may be prudent in helping the understanding of Our Blessed Lord's words of never being left alone. Fr. John Hurley and Francesca are here to assist you during your grief prolongment. Allow your "Tears of Sorrow" to warm into "Tears of Hope and Fulfilment of Blessings".
